

### SHUVAPRASANNA

When I want to write about Shuvaprasanna, memories from a life twenty five years back, fleet like scenes frame by frame in a movie. Words and memories. Suva of our College street by-lane. Smallish features. Plump. Anyway, he was not very old in those days, either, even then he was quite a legend. He had astounded the Russian leader Voroshilov & Krushchev by sketching an impromptu portrait. He had been showered with plenty of praises too. Shuva comes from a well to do conservative Brahmin family of Bhatpara, Calcutta. His father, a doctor, was a very liberal man. According to Shuva, it all started with portraits of people who dropped into his father's chamber. Then there was the struggle and survival through Calcutta art college. From the '70s onwards, Shuva's development has been meteoric.

Whenever I needed Shuva he was there. For illustrations in publications I would invariably turn to him. Then there were those instant portraits he did of people, in a small corporation park adjacent to New Market. And they would sell too, like hot cake.

One of my most memorable events was when Shuva had to paint the portrait of the deceased mother of Amal Lahiri, a friend of mine. Shuva had only a photograph of hers, in profile, as she lay in the cot that would take her for cremation. And her glasses. When members of the family saw the portrait, in oil, they broke down. My friend's father looked at it and cried out in agony. By '74, Shuva had almost become an institution.

The success of Shuva has not been luck or any such thing. Unlike the stereo-typed behavior, attire, eccentricities or idiosyncrasies often synonymous with artists, Shuva is the quintessential cultured Bengali. Extremely disciplined amiable, soft-spoken and with a charming disposition, Shuva has reached his present stature because of sincerity, perseverance and hard work. Shuva does not believe in art that is separate from social reality. Shuva said in an interview, "We got our freedom without paying a price... we have no art, no work that expresses social reality or chronicles the events of our national history. I recall only one or two artists - for instance, Zainul Abedin, who did an exceptionally powerful work after the famine in Bengal. He is the only one whose works were fired by the reality around. He responded with inspired feelings - but non else. Most artists try to project dreams".

Shuva's organisational capability is exceptional. With a handful of young artists he founded Artists Acre, an abode for artists where they can work near the Dumdum airport away from the bustling megapolis that Calcutta is. It was opened by Gunther Grass who is also a friend and admirer of Shuva. Great sitar maestro Pandit Ravishankar, Annada Shankar Ray, film maker Mrinal Sen, Pritish Nundy amongst them are notables who also graced the occasion. Shuva has also ventured into the world of poetry. Together with Shakti Chaterjee he co-edited a book of poems and drawings, Anarchy and the Blue...

Shuva had always wanted to have an exhibition in Bangladesh but it was not possible due to many reasons. I am very happy that this exhibition of Shuvaprasanno could take place.

My heartiest greetings go to Mr. Akku Chowdhury of La Galerie to arrange for this venture first by Shuva in Bangladesh.
