Shuvaprasanna's grammar of decay

For nearly three decades Shuvaprasanna has been in search of a visual language that would give form to his content of urban decay, and of anxiety for a total collapse of an urban culture. The culture that flowered for more than a century till the thirties, then started withering away, or rather gradually froze with memories of past glories and anguish of present failures, and that with almost a Spenglerian inevitability.

Calcutta, the city he comes from, has given us many celebrated painters and poets who created their own languages to give shape to their contents of disillusion and anxiety for a collapsing system of values, some seeking in the dying embers and cold ashes remnants of old flames, hoping against hope for a rejuvenation.

In the early paintings of Bikash Bhattacharjee and Shyamal Datta Roy, of course, very distinctive in their techniques and formation of imagery, we find architectural motifs that signify the collapse and decay. Shuvaprasanna has inherited both the past and present of the city, and has absorbed, internalised and responded to them in terms of his own individuated techniques and imagery, no matter whether he is painting, etching or drawing in mixed media.

That is why his flowers in mixed-media show petals with spider-web cracks of age, a certain dryness that seems to recall their luscious past, the past that was once emblamatic of urban man's thirst for natural beauty and pulsation of life.

His earlier large paintings of the city's roof-tops and dilapidated buildings and narrow alleys are denuded of human presence, but crowded with crows, as if they are expecting their kind of sinister feast. His etchings or mixed-media often show close-ups of predatory birds with sinister associations of death and decomposed corpses, of deserted city, of miles of desolation.


Shuvaprasanna's recent series of paintings of new iconographies of the 'popular' deities are a search for a new grammar of decay of faith in the divinities or divine interventions. Their bodies are empty cylindricals, their heads a little detached from their torsos, showing the dark emptiness inside the cylindrical bodies.

Shuvaprasanna's continuously evolving imagery of anxiety and his essentially urban sensibilities for an old, collapsing system of cultural coordinates can be syntactically related to those of his other contemporaries representative of his city and times.

"Hands"






"Crow"
